Novi nips North at Northville

Novi limited the North Farmington boys basketball team to one field goal in the fourth quarter Tuesday and rallied for a 62-55 victory in a first-round game at the Northville Christmas Tournament.

North, which led 45-39 after three quarters, made only one-of-eight shots and missed the front ends of four one-and-one free-throw attempts in the fourth quarter. Novi outscored North, 13-3, in the last three minutes to stay undefeated in four games.

"They play real hard and have a good ballclub that's well-coached," North coach Tom Negoshian said. "We missed some shots and they made some. But I'm very happy with our effort and I'm not going to fault anyone."

The Raiders, who are 0-3 overall, were led by Evan Ellis and John Pennala with 14 points each.

North made only 18-34 free-

throw attempts and Novi was 15-18. Senior center Scot Lord led North with nine rebounds, Ellis had eight, and Tom May seven points and seven rebounds. Jason Pawlowski contributed eight points.

"I don't ever remember being 0-3 at North," Negoshian said. Novi senior guard Brian Pierman, who scored a game-high 27 points on nine-of-15 shooting, tied the score at 62 on a three-point shot with about 200 left.

North's John Pennala split two free throws to make the score 52-52 but Novi went ahead for good, 54-53, on a baseline jump shot by Shawn Kelly with just less than a minute left.

Pierman stole a North inbound pass and scored on a layup to put Novi up 56-53, and the Wildcats made six straight free throws to seal the win.

The comeback was even more impressive since it was done after Novi's leading rebounder, senior center Rocky Dunlap, left the game in the first two minutes

with an ankle injury. Junior captain Jason Fannon played strong defense on Pennala and Jon Wroe scored 11 points off the bench.

Negoshian said he was not pleased with an official's call, with North ahead 47-39, early in the fourth quarter that helped give the momentum to Novi. Ellis apparently scored on a rebound basket and was fouled but the referee ruled Ellis was fouled before the shot so the basket was called off.

Ellis missed the ensuing one-and-one attempt and Novi scored the next six points to pull within 47-45.

HARRISON 65, R.O. KIMBALL 53: Farmington Harrison hit 12 of 14 free-throw attempts in the final

quarter to snare off Royal Oak Kimball. Charles Bamnerek led the way for the Hawks with 16 points plus some slick defense on Kimball's top gun Keith Dokho. Dokho averages nearly 20 points per game but was limited to 14 Tuesday.

Rick Smith scored 14, freshman Kevin Bamnerek added 10 points and six assists, and Calvin Pruitt contributed eight points and 14 rebounds. Harrison will take a 2-2 record into the break.

Kimball is 3-2.

FARMINGTON 80, BIRMINGHAM GROVES 73: Kevin Afterbaugh scored 12 of his 17 points in the final quarter to help push the Falcons to 4-1. Stan Lewis (25 points) and Scott Menser (22) paced the Falcons.

Guard Moose Thorpe scored 19 to lead Groves (0-4).

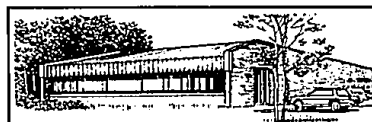
