Gilbert, who has worked in watercolor 22 years, paints Chinese elms for the imagination to dream by. Whether you're familiar with the grounds of Granbrook, or alirst time visitor, he provokes you into esperiencing the Cranbrook environment, tempting with snatches of serenity.

When it comes to Cranbrook, he's an amateur historian tempting you with tidhits about founders, George and Ellen Scripps Booth as well as Cranbrook resident architect Saarinen, who used to walk the grounds with legends like Frank Lloyd Wright.

"The Cranbrook complex is an

artistical, theotrical experience. Everything was designed with what the Greeks referred to as the golden means or golden section, a rectangular measurement, a naturally pleasing shape to the eye, said Gilbert who's been weaving since the late 1969s.
