

OU offers attention disorder seminar

The Oakland University Continuum Center will present a seminar on a disorder that is just becoming recognized, "Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) In Adults." The two-session program will be 7-9:30 p.m. Wednesdays, Feb. 16 and 23, on campus.

The disorder is characterized by an inability to sustain attention to specific tasks over a period of time and an inappropriate impulsiveness in activity and decision-making. It can include simple actions such as constant restlessness or more dramatic ones such as snap decisions with long-term consequences.

Dr. Bernard Travnik, one of Michigan's foremost authorities on the disorder, will present clear and easy-to-understand information, mixing facts and humor for a non-threatening, relaxing workshop any adult will understand.

Session One will trace the history of the disorder, its evolution and symptoms; participants will be able to draw up a profile of the disorder. Session Two will deal with next steps, personal strategies and successes. The program is suitable for personal use or to help another.

Saddle up for weather's rough ride

Brent Blair, managing director of the road commission for Oakland County, said that the ridges and bumps in asphalt paved roads will soon become potholes.

This circumstance will cause you difficulties when thaws occur and will cost the road commission significant time and money in the attempt to repair the potholes," Blair said.

A pothole is born when water from salting roads gets through the cracks in the pavement. The water freezes and expands causing the pavement to rise. Then, when thawing occurs, the ice under the bump melts. When a vehicle drives over the bump, it collapses and becomes a pothole.

Potholes cost the county taxpayers an average of \$22 each to repair. It's difficult to predict the number of potholes that will be created over the winter, but it's possible to spend at least \$1 million to fix them.

Not to be forgotten are people who live on gravel roads. Township governments and the road commission spent more than \$500,000 last fall trying to ensure that fewer gravel roads have problems in the spring thaw.

However, there will still be problems. Water will come out of the gravel in the daytime, but as evening approaches, the water will freeze and create icing problems until daylight. This is the way nature operates, creating problems for drivers.
