

LAST DAY FOR ACCEPTING VOTER REGISTRATIONS
For the purpose of RECEIVING APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION of the qualified electors in said city, BY LAW. Electors who wish to vote in the Statewide Special Election must be registered to vote no later than Monday, February 14, 1994. Persons may register at any Secretary of State branch office or at any county or city clerk's office. Persons who are currently registered need not re-register.

The purpose of the STATEWIDE SPECIAL ELECTION is to vote on the following proposal:

PROPOSAL A

A PROPOSAL TO INCREASE THE STATE SALES AND USE TAX RATES FROM 4% TO 6%, LIMIT ANNUAL INCREASES IN PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENTS, EXEMPT SCHOOL OPERATING MILLAGES FROM UNIFORM TAXATION REQUIREMENT AND REQUIRE A VOTE OF LEGISLATURE TO EXCEED STATUTORILY ESTABLISHED SCHOOL OPERATING MILLAGES RATES.

The proposed constitutional amendment would:

- 1) Limit annual assessment increase for each property parcel to 5% or inflation rate, whichever is less. When property is sold or transferred, adjust assessment to current value.
- 2) Increase the sales/use tax. Dedicate additional revenues to schools.
- 3) Exempt school operating milages from uniform taxation requirement.
- 4) Require a vote of legislature to exceed school operating milage rates.
- 5) Activate law raising additional school revenues through taxation including partial restoration of property tax.
- 6) Nullify alternative laws raising school revenues through taxation including an increase in income tax, personal tax exemption increase and partial restoration of property tax.

FOR DIGESTIVE SYSTEM PROTECTION

Non-steroid anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS) are a group of drugs which are widely prescribed in the treatment of arthritis and other conditions. They are generally safe but in high risk patients including the elderly they may be associated with a variety of side effects mainly in the digestive system. Such as indigestion, erosions on the surface of the stomach and duodenum, ulcers and in some cases, complications such as bleeding and perforation. Esophageal and small intestinal ulcers and strictures might also occur. Injury to and bleeding from the colon, and activation of colitis have been reported as well to a lesser degree.

To protect against such damage it is best to avoid the NSAIDS whenever possible. If you must take it, lowering the dose might help or alter the medication and/or other agents to protect the mucosal surface or digestive system can be given simultaneously.
