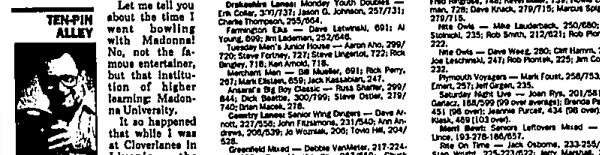


Madonna educates bowlers

pointed with the results of the final match.

"Oh, no, because he has state-qualifying potential," Tharnish said. "He had it coming in and he scored upon. Over the course of the year, he was 45-5 on take-downs, and four of the five were by the same kid — (Carl) Tuns of Northville. Not taking anything away from the other kid, but Marc Lesperance didn't show what he's capable of doing."

C'ville rally falls short

Lutheran High Westland held off a furious fourth-quarter rally by Livonia Clarenceville to gain a 62-59 Metro Conference boys basketball win Tuesday.

Senior guard Andy Manthei paced a balanced Warriors' scoring attack with 17 points.

Lutheran Westland withstood a 29-18 Clarenceville scoring run in the final period to gain the win.

Junior forward Jon Smolka added 14 points, while junior guard Chris Tieman contributed 10 points and five assists for the Warriors, now 9-9 overall and 7-5 in the conference.

Senior forward Mark Kalaj scored a game-high 30 points and grabbed 16 rebounds for the Trojans (8-9, 6-7). Kalaj also had eight steals.

Junior center Mark Berry chipped in with 10 points and six rebounds, while John Kalaj, still slowed by an ankle injury, had 10 rebounds and seven steals.

Trailing 31-20 at intermission, Clarenceville picked up the tempo with a full-court press. The Trojans made 10 of 12 shots from the field, but shot only 19 of 51 (37.2 percent) for the game.

Both teams shot accurately from the free-throw line. Lutheran Westland was 21 of 26 (80.7 percent), while Clarenceville hit 19 of 21 (90.4 percent).
