Local residents can quiz medical experts

Oakland County residents will receive an opportunity to question top medical experts face-to-face about all aspects of their physical and mental health at a Saturday, April 16, "Health Day On Campus" at Oakland University.

State Representative John Jomian, R-Bloomfield Township, will deliver the keynote address at 9 a.m. in Room 202, O'Dowd Hall.

Jomian said he "will be focusing on health care reform plans at

the state level, a part of which is in incremental, market-driven, approach to health care. We do not want to have radical social experimentation by changing what works for something that may not work."

At the commencement of the 87th Legislature, Rep. Jomian was named Republican chairman of the House Public Health Committee, and he was later named chairman of the Republican Health Care Reform Task Force.

Dr. Murray Levin, president of the Oakland County Medical So-

ciety, said the "Health Day On Campus" is "a chance for the community to meet with us and for us to help them address whatever health concerns they may have for themselves or for their loved ones. The OCMS is proud to be a sponsor for this event."

Participants are urged to register early to indicate first and second choice of the health care classes. Registration will also be accepted until 2 p.m. April 16, the day of the program, for any classes not filled by advance registration.

A sampling of the many health care classes in which physicians can be questioned are: Ask the Podiatrist; Recognizing Signs of Substance Abuse; Ask the Psychiatrist; Ask the Urologist; You & Your Physician — The Health Care team; Ask the Allergist; Ask the Gynecologist; and AIDS.
