"There's a definite benefit to staying at home, but caring for a freil elderly person is a full-time commitment," said Alexander Spiro, president and CEO of Charter Care Corp., with nursing homes in Farmington Hills and Novl.

"Usually, an acute incident like a stroke or fall puts the elderly in the hospital," he said. "Before considering home care, you need to evaluate the patient with the hospital social worker. A fur hospital worker. idea, but it makes all the difference when they see the unit." Anhony said.


