I tried to explain to him that unauthorized connections to cable without paying or unauthorized viewing of premium services that are not paid for are both misdemeanors punishable by imprisonment or fine.

On speaking with MetroVision's Regional Director for Marketing Dan Dinamore and Chrid Kukslak, Dinamore's amaketing clerk, I was told the cable industry estimates \$4.3 billion in lost revenue because of cable theft. The cable company's aim is certainly not to put people in prison make them pay hefty fines. They do, however, feel that everyone should pay their foir share. It is the honest subscribers who end up subsidizing those people who are stealing cable.

"MetroVision hus three cases of cable thete pending in federal court as well as up to 30 cases in various stages of investigation," Dinamore said. Area police agencies have been very cooperative in conducting search warrants. I was courious as to how cable companies could find out about such thievery. Dinamore told me that many times MetroVision employees working on cable may notice unauthorized lines.
