Through the years, she moves up the ladder, reporting to executive after executive, including members of the Hudson family. She goes from

typing through eight sheets of carbon paper and taking hours of dictation by hand, to copy machines, computer word processing and instantily faxing memos across the world.

"I can't imagine us getting any better or faster at communicating than we are right now," she said, laughing.
