Sandy Goosen, committee member of The Institute for Single Jewish Mothers, invites all single Jewish mothers to "Refocus: Create a Sharper Image" from 6:30-9:30 p.m. Thursday, May 19, at Oakland Community College, Orchard Ridge Campus, in Farmington Hills.

The evening will feature a keynote address, "Laughter is No Laughing Matter," and four workshops: "Resume Writing," "Financial Help," "Decision Making Skills" and "Dressing for Success on a Budget."

Marilyn Rowena, the keynote presenter, believes that "humor can bridge the fragile space between tears and laughter. A woman of good humor has the coping skills to fill the sometimes frightening transitions of a constantly changing world."

Her comments will precede an important evening of exploration as single Jewish mothers focus on some of those challenging transitions. Participants will have the opportunity to choose one of the four workshops.
