

## Flexible camp trains gymnasts

Aspiring Mary Lou Rettona can limber up this summer in a Farmington Public Schools gymnastic camp June 20 through Aug. 11 at the Farmington Training Center.

The course covers fundamentals, strengths, flexibility and conditioning. Skills are taught according to level of gymnast. The camp also prepares gymnasts for the high school program.

Jeff Dwyer, head coach of the North Farmington High gymnastics team, and Nicki Yuskowatz, an assistant coach, are instructors.

Cost of the camp varies based on the number of hours and days a person participates. A two-hour class is offered 9-11 a.m. for girls without a round-off back handpring. A three-hour class is offered 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. for girls with a round-off back handpring (without a spot).

Classes meet Monday through Thursday for eight weeks.

Cost for the 9-11 a.m. class is \$52 for one day a week, \$104 for two days, \$156 for three and \$208 for four. Cost for the 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. class is \$77 for one day a week, \$154 for two days, \$231 for three and \$308 for four days.

Registration takes place 11 a.m. to noon Monday, June 13, at the Farmington Training Center, 33000 Thomas, one block north of Grand River between Warner and School streets. People can also register by mail. Enrollment is limited to eight gymnasts.
