It won't be easy for Madonna University's softball team to find that answer. The Lady Crusaders opponent in the NAIA Bi-District round — a best-of-three series that starts with a double-header at noon today and concludes at noon Friday (if necessary) at Massey Field in Plymouth — is Shawnee State, from Portamouth, Ohio.

And there inn't much Madonna coach Jerry Abraham can asy about the Bears, except what he's heard second-hand:

"I understand where they're strong is pitching and up the middle," he said.

As any softball coach will tell you, that's a pretty good place to start.
