

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**THEFT**  
Two wheels worth \$680 and two tires worth \$220 were stolen from a black 1983 Ford Escort parked at the Mulwood Apartments on Highland in Farmington Hills May 5-6.

A princess diamond ring (\$900) was stolen from the Hardee's restaurant on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills May 3.

A hubcap (\$225) was stolen from a blue 1992 Cadillac Deville parked in a garage on Lakeside in Farmington Hills May 5-6. It was the fourth one stolen in recent weeks.

The ignition, dash and passenger door lock of a red 1990 Ford Escort parked on Blossom in Farmington Hills were damaged (\$600) and an AM/FM cassette radio (\$360), two Pioneer speakers (\$200) and a Pyramid amp (\$100) were stolen during an attempted auto theft May 6.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Detroit man, 31, for attempting to steal a black 1989 Mazda from the Clarion Hotel parking lot on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills May 5. The man was arrested in Southfield and the car sus-

tained \$850 in damage.

**BREAK-INS**

**DRUNKEN DRIVING**  
Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 38, for drunken driving May 8. The man was driving a silver 1983 Fleetwood north on Inkster south of 10 Mile when he was clocked at 60 mph in a 35 mph zone. He was pulled over on westbound 10 Mile. Two preliminary breath tests indicated blood alcohol levels of .14 and .13 percent, respectively. A level of .1 percent is considered legally drunk.

**BIRD RESCUE**  
Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 freed a crane that

had been caught in heavy duty kite string near a residence on Balamant Court in Farmington Hills at 11:11 a.m. May 6. The bird appeared uninjured when freed and flew away.

**FIRE**  
The owner of a 1986 Dodge Charger told Farmington Hills police he thought a newly installed oxygen sensor caused a fire in the car's engine compartment May 8. Firefighters from Station 3 put out the fire, which caused about \$500 in damage.

A careless smoker is believed to have ignited a mattress at a Hawthorne residence in Farmington May 9. Farmington firefighters extinguished the fire, which caused \$1,000 in damage.

**VANDALISM**  
Three strands of a 300-foot section of barbed wire fence at R.C. Merchant on Research in Farmington Hills was cut, causing \$350 in damage May 7-9.

The alleged incident took place at the Independence Green Apartments on Buchanan where the man, 24, lives. The woman told police the man dropped her off at Seven Mile and Telegraph after the incident. She called 9-1-1 from there.
