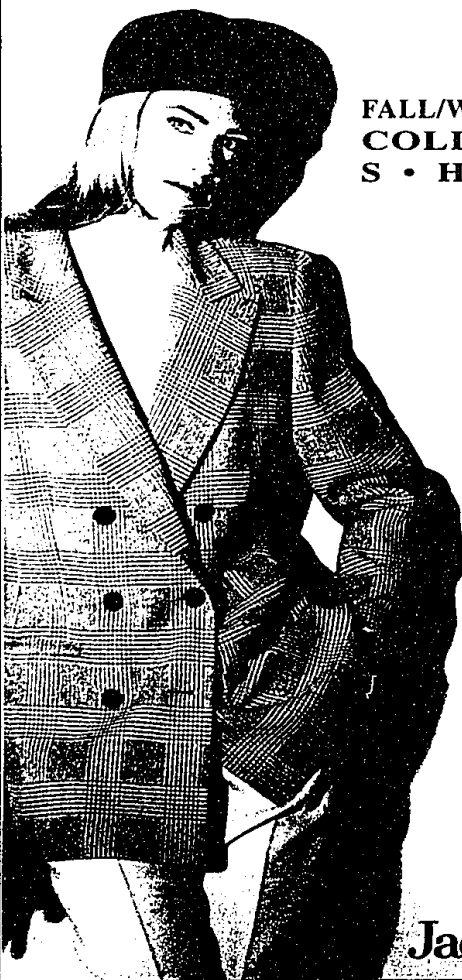

ASSAULT WITH MOTOR VEHICLE

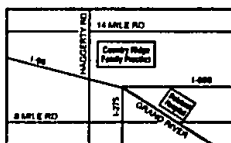
