

O'Connell sets record

Farmington Hills Mercy junior Eileen O'Connell was involved in two record-setting track performances Friday at the Lansing Waverly Invitational.

O'Connell won the 800-meter run with a record time of 2:20.2, and she was part of the Mercy 3,200 relay that finished first and set a meet record at 9:51.

Amy Freund, who was second in the 3,200 run with a personal best of 11:27.5, Lisa Nobles and Brandy Johnson were the other members of the relay.

The top records were 9:58.2 in the relay by Holland West Ottawa in 1990 and 2:23 in the 800 by Tobl McKern of Chesaning in '91. Mercy's 1,600 relay team of O'Connell, Tarrie Smith, Nobles and Johnson was second (4:11.8). Hence Arcene placed fourth in the shot put (33-3/4) and sixth in the discus (92-6), Smith fourth in the 400 (1:01.2), Mary Thewes fifth in the 3,200 (12:27.6) and Julie Angell sixth in the high jump (4-10).

"It was the first meet we ran to our potential this year," Mercy coach Gary Servais said. "In the field events, we could have done a little better but, hopefully, everybody will be on Saturday for the regional."

The Marlins and Farmington Hills Harrison were among the top teams at Waverly.

Harrison was fourth with 47 points and Mercy fifth with 42½. Ypsilanti won the meet with 84 followed by Holland West Ottawa (70), Grandville (66) and Ferndale (65).

"I look at some of the teams ahead of us, and I think we did real well," Harrison coach Mark Balcock said. "We finished higher than I thought we would."

Harrison's Devon Kennedy was second in the 400 run (1:01.1), and she was fourth in the 100 (13.1) and 200 (27.2).

Kennedy also teamed with Cicely Durdell, Angie Peana and Erika Greene for third place in

the 400 relay (2:52.3).

Allison Rue placed third in the 1,600 (5:31) and fourth in the 3,200 (12:21). The Hawks had other thirds from Mandi Berg in the shot put (34-5/4) and Rachel Buckley in the long jump (14-3).

Greene also was fifth in the 100 hurdles (17.3) and Michelle Howland eighth (18.0). Dana Olson and Nikki Hermann were sixth in the 300 hurdles (6:0.0) and 800 (2:29), respectively.

RAIDERS HAVE BIG DAY North Farmington placed a lot of track-and-field competition into Saturday, placing fourth at the Troy Athens Relay with an all-star team and winning a half-finished dual meet with Walled Lake Central.

The Raiders scored 23 points at Athens with only six girls to finish lead. The Raiders placed 47th, Troy (43) and Milford Lakeland (32). North's Allana Gordon and Devonte Plank teamed with Megan Keefe to win the discus (297-3) and Shannon McCoy to place second in the shot put (38-5/8).

Keefe, Heather Burcar, McCoy and Jaime Brenner were second in the Athens Relay (800-400-800) with a 7:17.5 time, third in the distance medley (13:23.6) and fourth in the 1,600 (4:19.7). The Raiders entered five events and scored in all of them. Gordon broke the school record she had set three years earlier with a throw of 37.2.

North whipped visiting Walled Lake Central 106-21 in the dual, which was stopped after five events April 28 because of bad weather.

Amanila Hough and Monica Czerwinski were double winners. Hough in the 1,600 (5:41) and 3,200 (12:10) runs, Czerwinski the 100 (13.1) and 200 (28.3) dashes.

Katie Atto won the 300 hurdles (54.8), Marie Caswell the shot put (32-6/8), Amanda Whitten the 400 (1:06.9) and Sarah Kern the 800 (2:44.9) Saturday.

Czerwinski, Allison Branton and Beth Purcell combined with Hillary Lum to win the 400 relay (56.1) and Keasha McCough the 800 (1:55.9). Tricia Traylor, Kari Little, Atto and Kern won the 1,600 relay (4:56.1).

In events completed April 28, Keefe was first in the discus (166-0), Mary, high jump (4-8), Burcar, long jump (14-8), and Gordon, 100 hurdles (18.7). Central won the 3,200 relay.

HAWKS RUNNERS-UP

"We're extremely proud of today," Canton coach George Przygalski said. "We achieved one of our goals, which was to win the division championship. We emphasize tradition in our program, but we don't want the past to overshadow today's accomplishments."

The Chiefs received impressive performances from Niko Okunubami, who was involved in four first-place finishes and Tracey Cavin, Mary Anderson and Becky Buckstone with three each.

RODGERS TRIPLE WINNER

Despite three first-place finishes by Kay Rodgers, Farmington lost at Livonia Stevenson 77-51 Tuesday.

After taking the long jump with a leap of 15-3, Rodgers, won the 100 (13.1) and 200 dashes (27.7).

Other individual winners for the Falcons were Dana Gula in the 3,200 (12:38.3), Tracey Finlayson in the 800 (2:29.1), Kim Washbrook in the shot put (33-6/8) and Andrea Salter in the high jump (5-2).

Farmington fell to 2-4 overall and 1-4 in the Lakes Division.

Marian ends Mercy's string of consecutive league titles

Birmingham Marian dashed Farmington Hills Mercy's hopes of winning a fourth consecutive Catholic League soccer championship Monday with a 4-2, first-round upset.

The visiting Mustangs scored the first two goals and were ahead all the way, leading 3-1 at halftime.

Theresa Cisco scored the first Mercy goal off a free kick and Lauren Hendrickson the second following a corner kick by Jenna Kluska.

The Marlins, who began the season 7-0-2, are 9-3-3 overall.

"We were going so strong at the beginning of the season," Mercy coach Deepak Shivraman said. "We're disappointed because we have some seniors on this team. They worked hard the last four years and for this to slip away is very sad."

Mercy also has been beset by injuries in recent weeks. Heather Richards and Flannery Campbell, the No. 2 and 3 scorers, suffered season-ending injuries as did Emily Lawrence, the team's top defender.

Beth Chmielewski, the regular goalkeeper, played her first game in several weeks after recovering from an injury.

"That's probably the biggest excuse we can use," Shivraman said. "After the Canton game, we lost some key players and that just deflated us."

The loss was not the result of not trying, according to Shivraman, who said the Marlins gave a full effort.

"We had a couple opportunities, but we couldn't put the ball in the net," he said. "It's the same old story for the last three or four games."

"Every player on the team has

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numbers on the goals or assist side. They were running, playing hard and making plays. It's just when we got to the 18 we panic and start taking bad shots."

On Saturday, the Marlins tied Trenton 1-1. Katie Cleers scored an unassisted goal in the second half for Mercy to tie.

Once again, Mercy outshot the opponent by a wide margin but didn't have the goals to show for it, Shivraman said.
