tion of Valley Forge certificate on behalf of the city and township of Farmington during a WWI radio presentation. The award was given to the Farmington community on behalf of the Harry Foster family, whose home and personal belongings were destroyed in a fire March 22, 1953. Immediately following the fire, in which Foster was burned severely, many people in the Farmington area first provided emergency aid and then constructed a new house for the Foster family. The certificate in recognition of outstanding achievement in bringing about a better understanding of the American Way of Life. Nearly every organization, as well as a great many individuals, participated in the community program. Delmontier said that, although he had the honor of accepting the certificate, it belonged to all Farmington-area residents.

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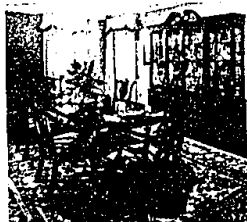
