The goals of the conference is to:

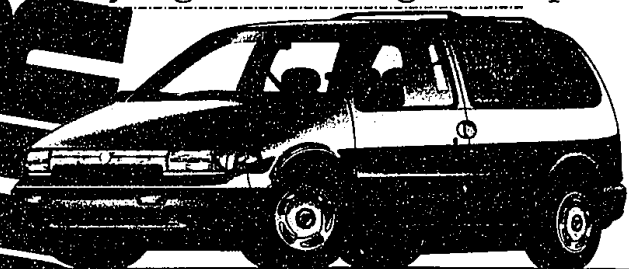
- Build collaborations among individuals and organizations throughout Michigan working on youth violence prevention and reduction;

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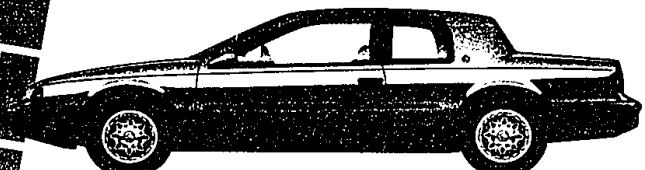
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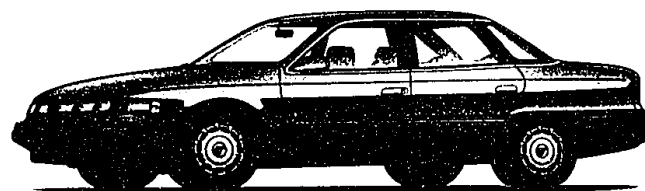
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
