33 drivers vie for taste of Indy-flavored milk

"It could be a radio-controlled car for all we know," says Paul Page, who serves as host of ABC's coverage of the 78th running of the Indianapolis 500.

Many viewers see Indy vehicles as just that - lightning fast minicars zooming around a loop. Page, who anchored ESPN's Indy 500 telecasts

coverage, wants to share his enthusiasm for auto racing with viewers by bringing them closer to the drivers.

"These guys are so neat," he says of the competitors.

Top in this year's "neat" field of 33, according to Page, are defending champion Emerson Fittipaldi and his teammates, Paul Tracy and Al Unser Jr.

They are "all driving for (Roger) Penske, all with a brand new motor that they just unveiled, the Mercedes Benz motor, which is just going to develop awesome power," Page says.

Another driver contending for the traditional taste of milk in the winner's circle is Nigel Mansell.
