### Case against Carlin faces challenge

Blams it on a bag of Jolly Rancher candy if the corruption case against former Oakland County Sheriffs Capt. Gerard Carlin goes down the tube.

Carlin's preliminary exam in 52-3 District Court derailed this week effer charges were made that an investigator probing the case broke into a secretary's deak at the Rochester Hills substation to get information for a search warrant.

Sgt. Stephen Jacobs, with the county Fugitive Apprehension Team, doesn't deny he opened Judy D'Allesandro's desk white searching through the substation in January 1993.

But it was to get some candy, he said. Not evidence.

"I went into he drawer and

"I went into her drawer and took some candy," Jacobs testi-fied. "I did not have her permis-

sion."
Carlin, former commander of the Rochester Hills station, faces 25 charges of misconduct, overtime shaving, faisifying expense reports and paying illegal overtimes to his top command officers. His attorney, Tom Kizer, requested an evidence hearing on Tuesdey after the deak break-in was revealed.

James A'Hearn, in charge of the FAT team, testified Jacobs and another investigator, Sgt. Dave Wurtz, did nothing illegal when they searched the substation. The two were sent there on a Saturday morning to find out what type of computers were used at the substation, and their serial numbers.

Nobody planned to enter any-one's desk, A'Hearn testified.

Jacobs testified he and Wurtz were about to leave the substation when he stopped at D'Allesan-

dro's deak to get a piece of candy. He said he knew about the candy because he worked in Rochester Hills sometime between 1990-91.

Lt. Doug Mollnar, who replaced Carlin as the station commander, testified there were three unauthorized break-ins into the public safety building between January and April 1993.

The first break-in occurred on Jan. 23, 1993. Mollnar testified he told A'Hearn about it on the following Monday.

A'Hearn refused to call the entry a break-in.

"They're sheriff's department employees with keys to (the) building." he testified, referring to Jacobs and Wurtz.

There was a sense of urgency to get the serial numbers and download the computers because investigators worried about evidence getting lost or destroyed, he said.

"You bear horror stories about whole programs getting dropped," and accidents happening. That's why I wanted to get moving as quickly as possible," Affearn testified. Investigators believed the computers contained information showing that Carlin spent time on politics while at work. Carlin was a key figure in County Executive. L. Brook Patterson's 1991 campaign.

L. Brook Pattersons and paign.
Nelson was expected to rule on the evidence hearing either late Wednesday, or Thursday.
Rariler, Nelson ordered Carlin so stand trial on five counts of covertime shaving. Carlin is accused of shaving around \$6,000° in overtime by billing the county for overtime worked in Rochester Hilla rather than the city. Rochester Hills contracts with the county for police services.
