

Barons wear Homeplate tourney crown

Joe Kalcynski of Farmington had differing perspectives on two tournament championships last weekend.

On Saturday, he was the catcher for Birmingham Brother Rice when the Warriors won the Class A title with a 15-3 rout of Southgate Anderson in Battle Creek.

On Sunday, he was the winning pitcher for the South Farmington Barons in the championship game of the Homeplate Sports Center tournament in St. Clair Shores.

Kalcynski pitched six scoreless innings, scattering five hits, Sunday as the Barons blanked the Lincoln Park Rails 3-0. He struck out five and walked two.

Farmington High pitcher Nick Latra got the Barons out of a seventh-inning jam to earn a save, striking out the last batter with the bases loaded.

Mike Daguanno and Dan Martinez had RBI singles for South Farmington, and Dennis Manning scored the other run on a delayed steal.
