In Farmington Hills, voters will decide the fate of a proposal allowing the city to sell general obligation limited tax bonds in order to build a multi-purpose ice arena at Founders Sports Park on Eight Mile.

Those who vote the Democratic Party ballot will also choose between Lynn Jonah, Larry Owen, Debbie Stabenow and Howard Wolpe to run for governor in the fall; and Joel Ferguson, John Kelly-Carl J. Marlinga, Lana Pollack, William M. Brodhead and Bob Carr to run for the U.S. Senate.

Voters choosing the Republican Party ballot will select between Spencer Abraham and Roma Romney for the U.S. Senate and Jan C. Dolan and Andrew Raczowski for the 37th District State House seat. Voters in the 18th County Commission District will also select by Moffitt and Sally Osann for that seat.

In addition, there is an issue for a new judge for the 6th Circuit Court. Running for that seat will be Michael S. Clawson, Marjory B. Cohen, Constance E. Cumby, Sylvia Kaufman Dellin, Daniel C. Devine Sr., Robert W. Easterly, Alice L. Gilbert, Paul Hynes, Elyan H. Levy, John J. O'Brien, Marcia C. Ross, Joseph Shulman and Thomas M. Brennan.

Raczowski delegate support questioned

Andrew Raczowski, challenger to state Rep. Jan Dolan in the 37th District, said a discrepancy in the number of precinct delegates supporting him was a misunderstanding.

Raczowski had claimed 23 delegates supporting him. Of those he named, several were running for precinct delegate. However, Raczowski has the support of at least six delegate candidates who are running unopposed, thus assuring seats. He did admit that some of his supporters (seven) had opposition in precinct delegate races.
