Occasionally gamy dialogue

aside, "Oats" does boast an immensely likeable quartet of principals.

The Outario-born Conlon, a 27year-old former stand-up comic, was the first signed for the show and seems a likely candidate to be its first breakout star. He boned his craft in Second City workshops in Toronto, and was one of the youngest headliners on the Canadian

youngest headiliners on the Canadian comedy circuit. His feature film credits include "Angels in the Outifield" and "Revenge of the Nerds III."
"Twe always wanted to have something to do with entertainment," he says. "I started out doing stand-up, which I really, really wanted to do. And I always wanted to do good comedy on television. I think it was more of a goal than a dream I had, and I was lucky to get where I am now with these people," he says of his castimates. be says of his castmates.

with so many of his scenes played opposite the comedically cutting Coulon, Rudd acknowledges that he will have his work cut out for him if e doesn't want Brian to turn as bland as oatmeal.
