

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

BRIKES-INS

A sliding glass door was pried open, causing \$200 in damage, and a Pepsi machine was broken into, causing \$300 in damage at the Independence Green Golf Course on Washington in Farmington Hills Aug. 23. An envelope with \$50 was stolen from inside the machine.

A door was pried open at Microcad Technologies on Haggerty in Farmington Hills and an \$800 Hewlett-Packard laser jet printer was stolen Aug. 22-23.

BAD CHECK

CARRYING A CONCEALED WEAPON

Farmington Hills police pulled over a cream 1979 Pontiac station wagon that was travelling north on Orchard Lake past 12 Mile at 1:10 a.m. Aug. 24 after it had swerved

and crossed the center line three times. The driver, a 21-year-old Farmington Hills man, refused to get out of the car when an officer asked him to take a field sobriety test. The man sped away at 85-90 mph and police gave chase before another unit pulled the car over into the lot of the Amoco station at 13 Mile and Orchard Lake. A search of the car revealed a role of bills (\$141), crack cocaine bags and a semi-automatic pistol. The man was arrested for carrying a concealed weapon and fleeing and eluding.

Between May 6 and Aug. 24, \$3,510.01 was embezzled from Universal Electric Products on Grand River in Farmington Hills.

STOLEN AUTO

Farmington Hills police were able to recover a stolen car and arrest three people at the Motel 6 parking lot on Grand River in Farmington Hills Aug. 26 at 12:30 a.m. Officers observed someone in a blue 1985 Mercury Lynx worth \$750 park in the lot and wait for

another car, a red 1991 Pontiac Firebird to pull up. A South Lyon man, 29, and his passenger, a 29-year-old Detroit woman, got out of the Lynx and talked to the Livonia man, 30, who got out of the Firebird. After checking, officers learned that the Lynx had been stolen in Eastpointe. On investigating, officers found that the three were meeting in one of the hotel's rooms, where officers also found drug paraphernalia. The South Lyon man was arrested for auto theft, the woman was arrested for receiving and concealing stolen property and the Livonia man was arrested for outstanding warrants.

DUNKEN DRIVING

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 28, for driving while drunk Aug. 26. The man had crashed his red Ford Escort into a large rock (3-foot diameter) on the property of a resident on Old Homestead, just south of 11 Mile in Farmington Hills. The man had a blood alcohol level of .19 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive.

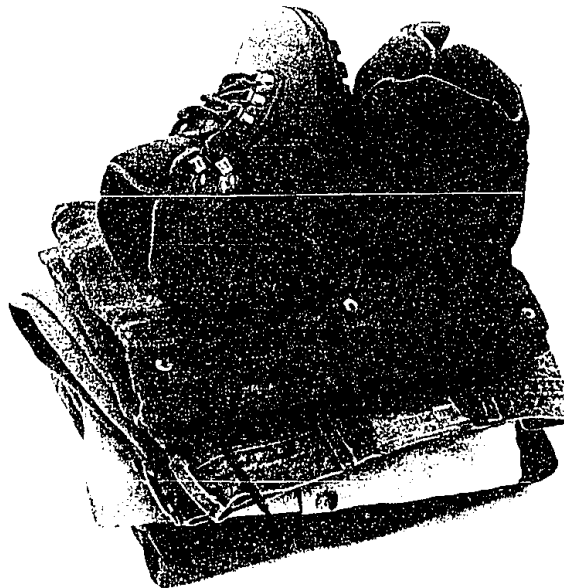
Students already admitted can
