Memorials may be made to the Salvation Army or to the church. Arrangements were made by the Thayer-Rock Funeral Home, Farmington.

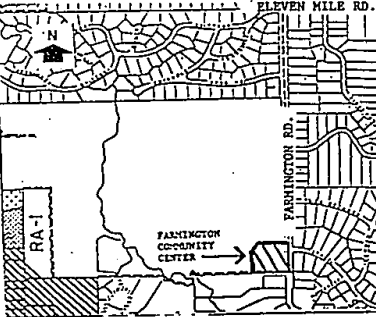
GEORGE J. AGAR

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Campbell at 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 6, 1994, in Council Chambers, 23400 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 287-1874.

PRESENT: Bush, Campbell, Hartsock, McShane, Tupper.

ABSENT: Nease.

OTHERS PRESENT: City Attorney Douglas, Director Com. Director Gushman, City Manager Lauboff, Deputy Clerk Schmidt, Adm. Assistant Schultz.

Minutes of the previous Special and Regular meetings of August 15, 1994 were approved as submitted.

Boys State Representative, Mike Langdon, reported on his experiences at the Boys State Program.

John Tremmel, Director of Real Estate for Arbor Drugs and Architect Matt Ray were present to update Council on their plans for the Arbor Drug Store.

Minutes of other boards were reviewed and/or filed.

Council granted a sign variance to the Hamsted Winery, 21406 Grand River. Council authorized outside seating at McNulty's Deli, 23330 Grand River. Council granted permission to the Farmington High School Band and Orchestra to conduct a "Tag Day" solicitation program to raise operating funds. Council postponed the sign variance request for Big Boy Restaurant, 22713 Farmington Road, until the September 19th Council meeting.

Council accepted the resignation of Margaret K. Paschke from the Farmington Area Commission on Aging.

Council passed a proclamation declaring September 17 through 23, 1994 as Constitution Week.

Council introduced Ordinance C-614-94 amending the Traffic Control Orders to Establish Permitted Parking on Lakeshore, Valley View, and Prospect.

Council denied the request for Easement Permit for Glens C Licensed Business at Page's Food and Spirits, Inc., at 23621 Farmington Road.

Council took no action on the Traffic and Safety Board recommendation on Downtown parking.

Council authorized the City Manager and City Clerk to enter into an agreement with Oakland County for Personal Property Assessment.

Council awarded a contract to Daylin Painting, in the amount of \$3,900.00, to paint the wood portion of the Electrical Museum.

Council received and filed the City Attorney Report on the practice of separate water and sewer charges.

Public comments were heard.

Council comments and recommendations were heard.

Council authorized Bradley Butler to fill a term to expire June 1997 on the Farmington Planning Commission, Kenneth Hils to fill a term ending June 1995, and Alton Bennett as an alternate on the Farmington Board of Zoning Appeals, and Doris Anteberry to fill a term to expire June 15, 1995 on the Farmington Area Commission on Aging.

Council authorized City employees had volunteer service awards.

Council scheduled a reception and dedication of the sculpture on October 3, 1994 at 8:30 p.m. and rescheduled the meeting with Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission for November 21, 1994 at 7:30 p.m.

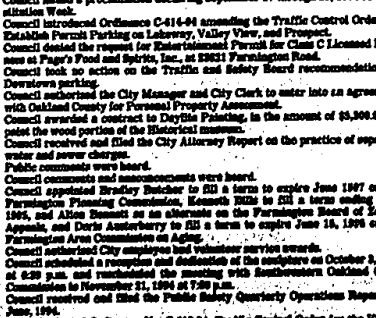
Council received and filed the Public Safety Quarterly Operations Report for June, 1994.

Survivors include his brother, Eugene Donnelly; 11 nieces and nephews.

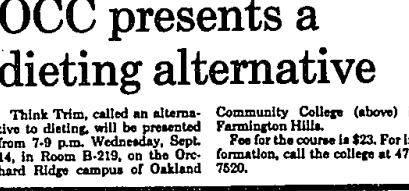

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Campbell.

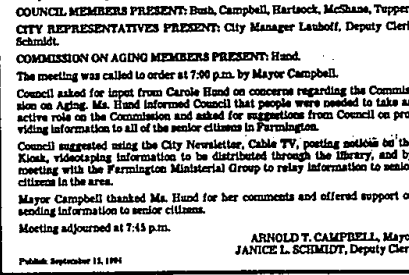

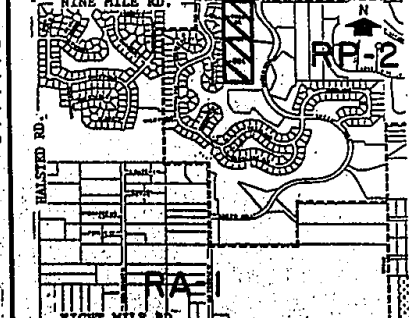
