School staff to receive training

Dr. Louis Gonzales, a nationally-recognized speaker on high-risk youth, will be the featured speaker at the Farmington Public Schools' annual "Inservice" for employees Friday, Oct. 14.

Gonzales has been a consultant to 89 schools in Los Angeles County on cultural diversity, classroom management, positive self-esteem, gang intervention and dropout prevention.

Schools will not be in session that day. Instead, teachers, principals and instructional paraprofessionals will attend a morning session at Harrison High to hear Superintendent C. Robert Maxfield and Gonzales speak.

Afterward, employees will return to their own buildings and attend sessions to focus on school improvement goals.

Other district employees will meet all day at North Farmington High. Dr. John Powers, a noted author, will address the morning session.

Powers has a doctorate from Northwestern University and has taught at the elementary, junior high and university level. He will discuss employee roles in the overall success of a school district. Maxfield will speak during the afternoon session.

Farmington schools offers training for employees throughout the year. Staff development has set up 104 after-school workshops for the 1994-95 school year, most of which are presented by district employees.

Resident named to EMU post

William Scheffler, a Farmington Hills resident and lecturer at Eastern Michigan University, was appointed teacher/placement specialist in EMU's Mathematics Department by the EMU Board of Regents.

He is a member of the Michigan Development Education Consortium.

As teacher/placement specialist, Scheffler will teach developmental mathematics courses, assist in the planning of the developmental mathematics curriculum, select educational materials, test and evaluate students for the purpose of placing them into appropriate mathematics courses and provide professional assistance in the mathematics lab.
