David B. McDowell, the legen

David B. McDowall, the legend-ary educator from the Clarence-ville School District who retired in 1984 after 18 years as uperin-tendent, died Bunday of cancer in his home on Louise in Livenia. In his 23 years in Clarenceville, both as principal of Clarenceville High and then as superintendent, McDowell left his mark.
In fact, when he retired in 1964, the district named its athletic field after him: the David B. McDowell Athletic Field. Today, his name still dominates the scoreboard on the field.
At the time of the dedication, McDowell said he was "humbled and overwhelmed" by the honor.

He joined the U.S. Marines in 1943, serving mostly in the Pacific until 1945. At the time of his discharge, he knew he wanted to be a teacher. It was a career he came to naturally, because his mother had been a teacher and his grandfather had been a school superintendent in Chippews County.

In 1951 he received his physical education degree from Northern Michigan University, where he was captain and most valuable player of the 1960 football squad. He sarned his master's in administration at Michigan East University and his specialist degree in administration from Eastern Michigan University.

His first teaching job was in 1951 at Pickford High, about 22 miles south of the Soo. While

teaching social studies, he served as assistant football and basket-ball coach and also coached un-defeated track teams.
