# **Drugged candy** report prompts police probe

Devil's Night, a big problem in Detroit, caused barely a ripple of trouble in Farmington Hills.

But Halloween was somewhat scarier — police are investigating a report that a local girl ate hallu-tinogen-laced candy.

The 7-year-old Southfield girl was trick or-treating in the Bridle Hills subdivision in Farmington Hills, just across Inkster Road from the girl a home near 10 Mile, when she received some Dots, a brand of gundrop candy, according to Farmington Hills police Chief William Dwyer.

The girl ate the candy when she

returned home and had a negative reaction.

Southfield paramedies took het to Beaumont Hospital, where she was treated and released.

"Doctors indicated that after preliminary observation, it appeared that the young girl had ingreated a hallucinogenic drug. Pathology tests are being done at this time," Dwyer said.

She was reportedly recovering at home and doing well Tuesday morning.
