

Drugged candy report prompts police probe

Devil's Night, a big problem in Detroit, caused barely a ripple of trouble in Farmington Hills.

But Halloween was somewhat scarier — police are investigating a report that a local girl ate hallucinogen-laced candy.

The 7-year-old Southfield girl was trick-or-treating in the Bridge Hills subdivision in Farmington Hills, just across Inkster Road from the girl's home near 10 Mile, when she received some Dots, a brand of gumdrop candy, according to Farmington Hills police Chief William Dwyer.

The girl ate the candy when she

returned home and had a negative reaction.

Southfield paramedics took her to Beaumont Hospital, where she was treated and released.

"Doctors indicated that after preliminary observation, it appeared that the young girl had ingested a hallucinogenic drug. Pathology tests are being done at this time," Dwyer said.

She was reportedly recovering at home and doing well Tuesday morning.

Farmington Hills police are going door to door in the subdivision in their investigation of the case and have warned all local elementary schools about the incident.
