**■ ARCHDIOCESE OF DETROIT**  
On Nov. 21, 400,000 Roman Catholics from the 161 parishes in Wayne County will be asked to contribute to a collection for the Campaign for Human Development.

The program was launched 25 years ago by the U.S. Catholic Bishops to fund community empowerment, self-help programs to attack the causes of poverty and powerlessness.

One of the organizations that has benefited from the campaign is the West Detroit Inter-Faith Community Organization, a group formed by 12 west-side church congregations in the area of Detroit north of Dearborn and south of the Jeffries Freeway.

The group has worked on major cleanups and re-openings of area recreational facilities, as well as rehabilitated housing.

It has also pushed for better police protection, prosecution of slum landlords, and greater responsiveness from politicians and bureaucrats at all levels of government.

**■ CONSERVATIVE JUDAISM**  
A parlor meeting in support of the Conservative (Masorti) Movement in Israel will be held at the home of Barbara and Irving Nusbaum of Franklin on Thursday, Nov. 17.

The Masorti Movement includes 36 congregations, a youth movement serving more than 1,000 youngsters, summer camp, day camps, programs to teach basic Judaism to new Russian immigrants and a paraprofessional job training program for Ethiopian immigrants.

The Nusbaums recently chaired the Detroit area Israel Independence Day Celebration.

Allan Warshawsky, president of the Masorti Movement, will speak at the Nusbaum's home about recent successes in promoting the legitimate religious rights of all Jews in Israel. He moved to Israel with his family 15 years ago and has a long history of involvement in Jewish affairs both in the United States and Israel.

In the United States, he held leadership positions in many organizations including New York Federation of Jewish Philanthropies, The Brandeis School, the LeRoy Zionist Movement and the American Association of Jewish Education.

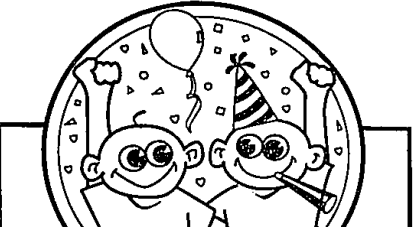
