Farmington High's student council spent Dec. 11 caroling at the Grand River Village. The student council also takes part in bingo at the senior residential facility and has a spring dance there.

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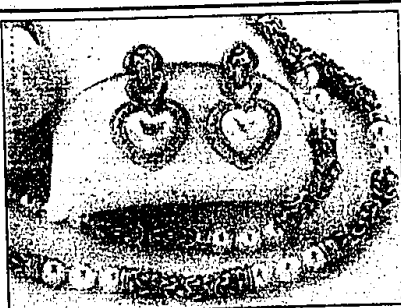
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
