Farmington man joins retirement board

Wasen has lived in the city for eight years. He is executive vice president of MetroBank and has more than 18 years of commercial banking experience.
Before moving to Farmington, Wasen was past president of the Fenton Area Chamber of Commerce and was involved in other area programs.
Wasen's term expires in June 1997. The city requires that a vacancy on the board be filled by a resident who receives no benefit from the retirement system.
The retirement board meets quarterly and administers and manages the employees' retirement system. The five-member board includes a councilperson, two members elected by city employees, the city manager, and one citizen appointed by the council.
