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Hills police investigate assault attempt on girl

Farmington Hills police are investigating the attempted assault of a 10-year-old Hills girl at about 6:45 p.m. March 16 at Harrison High School.

The girl, a Forest Elementary School student, was playing outside of the high school along with two brothers and a sister while her mother was inside at a parent-teacher conference.

The girl, who was not hurt, told police that a man asked her to go

into a girls' locker room inside the school for him. They went inside the building and up a flight of stairs on the building's west side, but when they reached an upper floor, the door was locked.

At that point, the man grabbed the girl from behind in a bear hug and tried to unnap her shorts. She screamed and the man let go. Then she fled down the stairs where she found a lower level door locked.

The girl then waited before going back up the stairs and out of another open door where she found her mother and sister.

The man was described as white, from 20-30 years of age, 6-foot, with brown, collar-length hair and a medium build. He was wearing a white shirt, long khaki pants and brown shoes.
