Tour to explore roots in Detroit

Adat Shalom Synagogue members will explore the congregation's roots on an afternoon bus tour of Jewish Detroit, Sunday, April 30.

The 50th anniversary event will roll along from noon to 5 p.m. Veteran tour guide Aaron Lupovich will chart the course and provide a description of the sites and scenes memorable to Jewish Detroiters for decades.

The bus will make stops at previous locations of several temples and synagogues, including the former Adas Shalom Synagogue building on Curtis Avenue between Wyoming and Livernois.

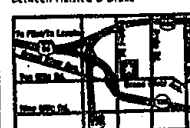
