Schools urged to boost scores

No Clarenceville school received the highest accreditation rating last week from the Michigan Department of Education.

Mostly because of test scores, the state gave schools in the Clarenceville School District arating that's midway between schools at the top (summary) and achools at the bottom (unaccredited). All local schools metaone but not all of the state's standards.

Local schools joined the bulk of state schools, about 3,000, which camed interim accreditation. It's their task in the year ahead to boost their Michigan Education Assessment Program (MEAP) scores high enough to climb into the top category.

CLARENCEVILLE

"It's got to be done; there's no if, ands or buts about it," said Clarenceville Superintendent David Kamish.

No local school suffered the ig-nominy of being among the 89 schools statewide which wound up unaccreditated, at the bottom of the list. These 89 schools face a 5 percent loss of state aid if they don't improve.

But no local school gets to bask in the limelight which comes from being listed among Michigan's top-ranked schools in the first list ever published.

Accreditation for all Michigan public schools is one of the many

mandates the state has decreed to boost the quality of education in the state.

Accreditation is based chiefly on acorae carmed on the MEAP math, acteror and reading tests. But it also includes compliance with numerous dictates from the state. These include annual performance reports to parents, eschool improvement plans and mission statements.

To earn the top ranking, 60 percent of students in the school must peas the MEAP exams in all subjects in at least two of the last three years.

In getting interim accrediation, the 90 percent of schools either met or exceeded the 66 percent standard on some of the MEAP tests and fell below that level on others.
