

After Distel died in the late 1520s, the school was taken over and relocated by Elizabeth Braasart who welcomed two generations of cooks from many countries, revised the curriculum, and oversaw the U.S. governmentfunded classes for American Glaster World War H.

By 1950s, Le Cordon Bleu represented not only the highest level of culinary training, but it became the symbol of Paris itself. When Audrey Hepburn attended a Parislan cooking school in the film Sabrins, the inference was to Le Cordon Bleu not 1950, American chef Julia Child graduated from the Le Cordon Bleu and proceeded to teach her countrymen what French cooking was all about.

In 1984 Mme. Brassart (in her 80s) acreed to sell the Cordon

Bleu to Andro Cointreau, a descendent of Frence's most emisent families: the Cointreaus and the Remy-Martine.

In 1988, Cointreau relocated Le Cordon Bleu to its present state-of-the-art headquarters on a quiet street on the Left Bank, not far from the Eiffel Tower on le rue Leon Delhomme.


