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This has location, location, location

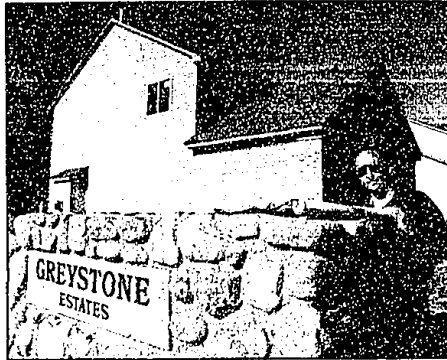
■ A good location close to Hines Park, freeways and downtown Plymouth makes Greystone Estates an attractive buy. That's how the developer/builder of a small project at the site of a former church sees it.

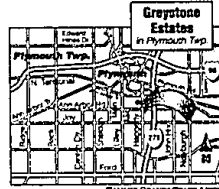


An in-fill residential project at the site of a former church in Plymouth Township enables buyers to acquire a good product at an unbeatable price in a great location, the developer/builder says. Greystone Estates, 25 lots on 71/2 acres off Haggerty between Ann Arbor Trail and Ann Arbor Road, is the work of Robert Schwartz, president of United Homes in Farmington Hills. "I knew it was a fantastic in-fill location," Schwartz said. "It has great freeway access, it's in a residential area and across the street from an elementary school."

Hines Park is a short jog or bicy-

cle ride down Haggerty and downtown Plymouth with all of its quaint attractions and shopping is walkable up Ann Arbor Trail, he added. Three distinct floor plans are available at Greystone for less than \$185,000.

Standard features in all three include separate tub and shower in the master suite, range and dishwasher in the kitchen, 2 1/2 baths, fireplace,

two-car attached garage, basement, first-floor laundry, bedroom ceiling lights and covered porch.

Two models are under construction. The Chelsea, a Cape Cod with nearly 1,950 square feet, features the master suite on the main level and two bedrooms with loft or three bedrooms upstairs.

The loft option, expected by Schwartz to be selected by most buyers, overlooks the great room, and can be used as a computer/exercise/sitting area.

With either option, the upstairs contains a full bath.

The first floor, in addition to the master, offers a room that can be designed as a formal dining room or library, kitchen/eating nook and great room with sloped ceiling.

The model is priced at \$182,075.

The other on-site model, the Kensington, is an 1,850-square-foot story and a half with three bed-

rooms and two baths upstairs. The master has two walk-in closets.

On the main level, the living room flows into the dining room — each with 10-foot ceilings — and the eating nook connects with the family room. A kitchen counter has a snack bar for quick meals on the go.

Recessed lights are over the fireplace in the family room.

The model sells for \$174,750.

The other floor plan available to buyers, the Edmonton, is a 2,025-square-foot colonial with a living room, dining room and family room on the main level and a choice of four bedrooms or three bedrooms with loft upstairs.

The base price is \$178,275.

Exteriors have some brick on all four sides and vinyl siding.

Greystone will have sidewalks, city water and sewers and access to the Plymouth-Canton Commu-

The female-owned business staffed with successful female account executives primarily places women in permanent job positions.

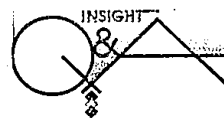
The franchise, owned by Nancy Moeller of West Bloomfield, was selected Office of the Year for 1994 among 350 in the OfficeMates5 network, a division of Management Recruiters.

Theresa McShane, a Rochester resident, was National Account Executive of the Year both last year and in 1993.

Two other staffers, Marsha Haller and Michelle Park, have earned National Rookie of the Year honors for placement performance.

Kathy Chiechik, the fifth member of the team, heads up the temporary placement end of the operation.

Following are edited excerpts from a recent interview with Moeller



and McShane.

Who exactly do you place?

McShane: Some titles we've placed are administrative assistant, executive secretary, secretary, customer service, receptionist, medical biller, accounting clerks.

Moeller: Bookkeepers.

Ninety-five percent are women. Last year, we placed 375, I think. I'd guess 75 percent were permanent, 25 percent temporary or temp to hire (tryout).

This year, I expect it to be more
