he \$250,000 Michigan Mile Handicap, ackeduled for Saturday, July 15, has been postponed until the fall, Ladbroke DRC Executive Vice President and General Manager Jay Fortney announced.

Ladbroke officials postponed the race pending Governor John Engler's decision on gambling policy and the outcome of the horse racing industry bill.

"With the uncertainty of our legislation in Lansing, we couldn't ask horsemen to prepare their horses for the Mile not knowing if we were going to run it." Fortney said. "By postponing the race, we will find out in late June 16 our industrials has a future and if we can afford to run a race of the Mile's magnitude later in the season."

The Michigan Mile had run for 45 consecutive years before being canceled in 1994 due to significant declines in handle and attendance when Casino Windsor opened.

who clearly has bigger objectives in mind.


"We are shooting for the crown this year and this is one step," he said.
