

# Ex-CC coach Holowicki takes college job

ly 66 Holowicki. "I don't know if it's a good situation," he said about the Madonna job. "I'm leaving a great situation (at Wayne Memorial). There were so many nice people there."

"He was treated like a first-class citizen over there. That was probably the biggest hangup."

But he decided to leave Wayne, where he served as an assistant coach last season, partly because of Madonna's persistence. Athletic Director Ray Summers said he wanted a coach with experience to replace the departed Bill Sharpe; in Holowicki, he has that.

"They waited for me forever — almost six weeks," Holowicki said. "I was really vacillating, but I wanted to do what was right for my family."

Holowicki felt that he is "going from a situation where they're going to be winning for the next couple of years (Wayne reached the state quarterfinal last season) to something that's not so certain."

His unfamiliarity with the Madonna program contributed to that impression. Holowicki admitted he knew little about the team or the players. "I have no idea. All I know is they weren't very good. The only (player) I talked to was Brandon Stone. Nobody knows how many kids are coming back."

But the Madonna staff knew him, certainly. Holowicki has been involved in coaching prep

basketball for 30 years; his overall record (612 wins, 216 losses at CC and Detroit St. Gregory) puts him third on the state's career list for most wins by a prep coach, not to mention seven Catholic League, 23 divisional, 18 district, five regional, and one state Class A championship (1976).

"He will do great things for our program," said Madonna Athletic Director Ray Summers. "He's got a lot of energy — he's tireless."

"Anyone who knows basketball in this state knows Bernie. We feel he can elevate this program, and that's what I'm excited about. He's a tactician who knows fundamentals and is a teacher of the game."

Holowicki's 22 years at CC ended sadly when he was forced to resign following the 1993-94 season. He was Chuck Henry's assistant at Wayne last season.

His coaching ability will certainly be tested at Madonna, where he replaces Sharpe, who was fired in March following his — and the team's — second season. The Crusaders were 8-55 in those two years.

But his record was only part of the reason Sharpe was replaced. "I don't think you measure success by just wins and losses," said Holowicki, adding he did not want to comment on the former regime, "but by other things as well."






