There are far too many good people who live here that will not put up with this," Dwyer said. "This is bad for them, it's bad for the Jacksons and it's bad for the city."

To that end, the Hills City Council has authorized a \$1,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of those responsible.

Extensive vandalism carries a jail term of up to 15 years. Ethic intimidation carries a penalty of two years in jail and a \$5,000 fine.

Dwyer said police have possible suspects and hope that some physical evidence, including fingerprints from the crime scene, will lead to an arrest.

Jackson said her husband had reported gang graffiti painted on the street near their home on May 21.

"We're from Chicago so we've seen enough gang graffiti to know what it is," she said. "I don't know, but someone might have seen my husband talking to the police about it."

Jackson said she and her husband are used to looking out for the neighbors.

Bruce Carr, a Farmington Hills resident and member of The Christian Businessmen's Committee, said his group is contributing money to help the Jacksons.

versity and went straight into law school. Her husband is an accountant as is her father, Yale, who has been seen beaming at his daughter's undertaking at both candidates' forums.

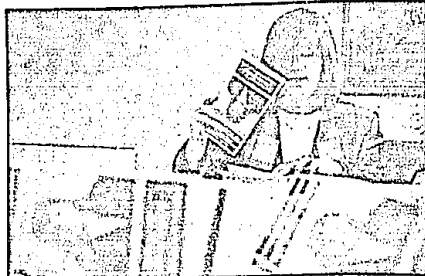
"He enjoys seeing me taking on new challenges and always striving," Levin said. "They're helping me with my campaign."
