OAKLAND COUNTY PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION MILEAGE PROPOSAL Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the Oakland County Public Transportation Authority area be increased by 33 cents (\$0.33) per thousand dollars (\$1,000) (0.33 mill) of the taxable value on all taxable property in the Authority area for three (3) years, 1995, 1996 and 1997, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for support of a public transportation system serving the general public within the Authority area? I. PRIMARILY FOR REMODELING BUILDINGS AND TECHNOLOGY

Shall Clarenceville Schools, Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Four Million Four Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand (\$4,425,000) Dollars and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for the purposes of:
