"John made good use of his exceptional strength and competitive drive to progress further than any first-year receiver I've ever seen," CC coach Tony Magni said. "He scored many big victories to lead us to an undefeated dual season, the Catholic League championship and the city championship."

Sporadi, a linebacker-turned-back, was a first-team All-Obersever choice in football. He was also Class A runner-up as a heavyweight in wrestling.

Corey McClelland, Wayne, 100 lbs: The senior uncorked the area's slickest throw at the Mega Conference Red Division meet with a toss of 157.6, which was good enough for first.

"Corey is strong with very good technique," Wayne Floyd Carter said. "He made tremendous improvement over last year."

He was excellent this year after a late start because of a question whether we were going to have a team."

McClelland was also a first-team All-Area inebriator in football.

Brent Washington, Glenn, long jump: The senior, heaved for Michigan on a football scholarship, posted the area's best jump of 21.10n.

He was selected in dual meets, while winning titles at the East Relays and Jackson Northwest Metro Relays. He was named up as a standout hurdler, but by the state meet he foundered at the regional.

Washington was also one of the area's top sprinters with a personal best of 10.9 in the 100-meter dash.

Brent is a superior athlete that comes along too infrequently in a coach's career," Glenn's head coach said. "Brent makes coaching very exciting. He is a pleasure to coach an outstanding athlete and also a superior athlete."

Doug Brodowski, Harrison, high jump: The junior cleared 6-4 for an area best at the Oakland County Meet where he finished third.

Brodowski took a second in the regional to qualify for state and was third in the Western Lakes Activities Association meet.

"Doug was a consistent jumper all season," Harrison coach Ann Reed said. "This is only his second year in the high jump. He has the ability to dominate near the end of his jump to win. He's a tremendous person and a great team leader."

Paul Terek, Franklin, pole vault: Just a sophomore, Terek was over a foot better than the rest of the competition this year.

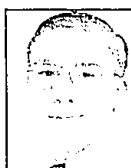
He captured the Western Lakes meet with an area best vault of 13.8. He also cleared 13-4 to finish second in the regional, qualifying for state. Terek broke the school record (13-7) in a dual meet against Plymouth Canyon.

He was undefeated in dual meets, too. Terek also ranked among the top 10 in the 400 run (52.9).

"Paul set goals at the start of the year, and he achieved every one," Franklin coach Dave Lee said. "He's a tremendous athlete, just not a pole vaulter. He's got a 1/4 way to go, but he's still starting to take his potential."

Terek also comes home to an All-Area in the classroom.

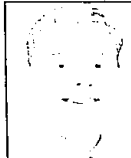

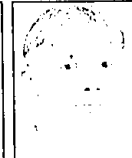

800, Kessel capped an outstanding year by finishing second in this year's state Class A meet with an area best time of 1:55.5.

His regional clocking was 1:56.6.

Kessel also made All-Mega White the 800, 800 relay and 1,600 relay.

The 1995 co-team MVP ranked in five different Oberseverland top 10 ratings including the 100 (111.0), 200 (22.0), 400 (51.1), 800 (1:55.5) and 1,600 (4:40.0).

"Beyond his obvious talents as a runner, Tom has a strength of character that will carry him through a lifetime of achievements," Jones said. "He is the finest runner I have ever coached."

Jared Blinleck, Salem, 1,600: The junior took a ninth in the state Class A meet with a time of 4:24.5.

Blinleck also won Western Lakes titles in the 1,600 (4:27.0) and 3,200 (9:46.2). He took a fifth at the fast RU regional with a state qualifying time of 4:26.1. His best in the 3,200 was 9:45.1.

He also helped break Salem Rock records in the 8,400 relay and distance medley.

"Jared worked hard all year; he was a dedicated distance runner and showed good leadership on the track," Baker said.

Joe Leo, Redford CC, 3,200: The junior was Catholic League champ, Operation-Friendship champ and was undefeated in dual meets. He is one of the big reasons why CC won both the Catholic and the state titles this year.

Leo took a fifth in the fast RU regional (9:24.5) and was fifth in Class A (9:25.0). Leo won the Oberseverland open 1,600 race two years in a row, where he posted an area best of 4:24.0.

"Joe takes nothing for granted," Magni said. "and foremost, is a dedicated and enduring athlete."

Last fall, Leo took fourth in the state Class A (team) cross country championships.

Kreg Knight, Redford Union, 200: Knight enjoyed a barrier senior year by posting area best times in both the 200 (22.4) and 100 (10.0).

He went 22.4 twice as he was regional runner up and Mega White champ.

Knight was All-Mega White Division choice in the 100, 200, 800 relay and 1,600 relay. He was also voted co-RU MVP in 1995.

"Kreg has always done more than what is asked of him," RU coach Tom Jones said. "He set the tone for many of our team's best efforts. His talents and enthusiasm will be missed."

Jason Barytski, Salem, 400: The junior was undefeated in dual meets and posted the area's best time (1:30.3) in the 400 at the Michigan Meet.

Barytski, who took a third in the WLA meet, was the anchor man on Salem's state qualifying 1,600 relay team.

"Jason is a hard worker, runs with a lot of heart and he's hard to beat when he's got the lead," Salem coach Geoff Baker said. "He runs with a lot of guts. He always pushed himself to do the best he could. He could run anything from the 100 to 500 very well."

Tom Kessel, Redford Union, 800: The senior was regional champ and first-team All-Obersever two consecutive years in the
