CHARLES J. KILEY
Mr. Kiley, 65, of Munising, Mich., a former employee of the Farmington Enterprise newspaper, died July 28 in Munising Memorial Hospital. He had been ill about a year.

Born in Bay City, Mr. Kiley, was the owner and publisher of the Munising News until he retired in 1992. He lived in Farmington from 1952-66 while working for the Enterprise and the Plymouth Mail. After employment at those papers, he moved to Munising and bought the News.

Mr. Kiley was a member of the Munising Moose Lodge and the Roderick Prato Post 131 of the

American Legion. He was a World War II U.S. Army veteran, serving 1951 until December 1962. During this time he was stationed in Germany where he started a newspaper for servicemen overseas.

Survivors include his wife, Phyllis; son, Michael; daughters, Susan White and Beverly Elsmann; brothers, Dennis and Francis; sisters, Mary Ellen Gregory and Ann Cahill; eight grandchildren.

Mass was celebrated July 31 in Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Munising, the Rev. Gregory Hoikala officiating.

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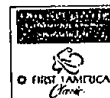
