Harris finishes course

Judge Frederick L. Harris of the 47th District Court in Ferm-ington is recipient of the Diploma of Judicial Skills awarded by the American Academy of Judicial Education (AAJE).

Harris completed 129 hours of on-site, intensive course work at the Harvard Law School and the University of Virginia, Char-lottesville.

Only 122 state court judges have successfully mot the course requirements within a stated time frame. Of the 24 states represented, Michigan now has four awardees.

To receive the diploma, a law-trained judge, must in six years, attend and complete four funda-mental and interrelated courses:

"Philosophy of Law and Judg-ing" — a judge must often turn for guidance to philosophical principles.

"The Judge as Fact Finder and Decision Maker" — the first nec-essary step in resolving cases is to find fact.

"Constitutional Criminal Procedure."




