## College hoop coaches scramble after late starts



A tale of two programs.

Certainly, many people doubted Glee Donahue's senity when he chose to ceach Schoolcraft College over Medonnu Unit versity. I mean, the logical choice would be the four-year basketball program instead of the two-year.

There were no winning tradi-tions involved, that's for sure.
Both schools have been mired in mediocrity — no, that's not right.
Neither has been that good.

But Madonna at least had a reason for its struggles. It was a new program, just two years old; it was expected to have some prob-lems the first few years. SC hasn't

been any good at the junior col-lege level for more than a decade. So why would Donahue choose SC over Madonna?

SC over Madonne?

His reasoning may never, truly, be known. That's because Donahue isn't the kind of guy to bedmouth others. Indeed, he bit his tongue and swallowed hard when questioned about the SL Mary's College fiasco (after leading the Eagles to the NAIA Tournament twice, the administration dumped basketball and Donahue because of financial difficulties, refusing to publicly take the open shot.

This much is home. Donahue

This much is known: Donahu-This much is known: Donahue had a choice between the two. He opted for SC, leaving Madonns to scramble. Fortunately, the Crusaders' administration was able to get another coaching legend to step in: former Redford

Catholic Central coach Bernie Holowicki. Who will fare better? A diffi-cult, and somewhat unfalr, com-parison to make.

But there were similarities in
the two hirings. For one, both
came late — too late to launch an
effective recruiting campaign.
However, the two coaches cach
have something to build around.
Neither was facing an empty
router.

Still, as previously alluded to, both programs needed an overhaul.

And that's where the two coaches' approaches parted. Donahue had five players from last year, and two more who played for SC prior to that, to start with — not a bad foundation for a two-year school. He wasn't idle, though; he rounded up seven

others who should help transform the Ocelots into a docent team.

Holowicki wazn't idle, either, but his offorts were less successful. His open tryouts, held throughout the summer at various sites, reaped almost nothing that will provide any help.

"We were looking for anyone who could play," the Madonn coach said. "We'll have to ride the rapids with what we have." It's not all gloom, but it's hard to project much optimism after a 6-25 season. In Bill Sharpe's two seasons as coach, Madonna managed a meger 8-35 mark.

So saying just about everyonertums doean't instill much confidence. And noting that two of the better Crusaders— leading scorer Jay Dimes and center Eric Furlotte—are the two losses from last season dims the picture further.

"Things are wide open," said Holowicki. "We've got about 16 guys, though, and that's good. There's a couple of good kids... And the work ethic's gotten bet-

And the work ethic's gotten better.

"At least I was able to get a beed on the kids that are there. That part (of the summer work-outs) was good. I got to know them and they got to know them and they got to know me." Holowick was disastisfied with the team's overall physical condition when he took over. That was one thing he feels he changed. And, for now anyway, it will have to do. He doesn't plan further workouts until October, preferring to let his players acclimate themselves to their classes and schoolwork.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Donahue is through for now, too. But there's no doubt his late-season efforts will make a considerable, and immediate, difference. A program languishing in defeat, season after season, needed an instant boost.

The Hall of Fame coach sup-plied just that by bringing in sev-en players who measure 6-foot-4 or better.

As SC athletic director Ed Ka-vannugh noted when asked about former SC coach Dave Bogataj, "Dave was a nice guy, but he just couldn't win."

— count on that. Holowicki will
do the same at Madonna, it just


