Design is just a part of building project

Q. I would like to use my home planning computer software to pro-duce a kitchen design for a contrac-tor to use. Do contractors accept these for estimating materials and Will this save me money with an architect?

A. General contractors and architects A. General contractors and architects appreciate clients who have a good idea of the design of the project and the scope of work to be performed. A hand-trawn sketch or a computer-generated drawing may save days or weeks normally spent on design meetings with your architect or design/build contractor. But design is just one component of the project. A budget needs to be estab-lished, and all materials need to be specified for an accurate proposal to be generated. Your contractor will guide your decisions on everything from flooring to plumbing fixtures, cabinets to counter tops, based on your budget.

Your kitchen design will not save you a significant amount of money as most architects base their fees on a percentarchitects base their rees on a percent age of the total project budget. As men-tioned previously, your preliminary de-sign will get your project off to a quick start as opposed to one starting from scratch. However, your design will prob-

ably not satisfy plan review require-ments for a building permit at your lo-cal building department. Your architect or design/build contractor will need to or design/bulk contractor will need to generate a set of working drawings. Theze drawings, based on the complexi-ty of your project, may contain informa-tion regarding site plan, foundation plan, floor plan with existing walls, walls to be removed and new walls. They also may include exterior eleva-tions, section(s), interior elevations, an electrical plan, as well as material spec-ifications and general notes. If possible have a preliminary design of your project, either hand sketched or com-puter generated. Magazine pictures and

other ideas that you would like to incor-porate are also very helpful. Take ad-vantage of your design/build contractor or architect's years of experience. They will save you time and money, but more important, they will help make your project a success.

Good deck design should be as thorough as new house design. Site plan-ning, activity planning, traffic pattern, landscaping, construction materials, landscaping,

lighting, noise, privacy, artistic interest and architectural harmony with your house are a few of the key dealgn issues. nouse are a rew of the key design issues.
All of these areas require familiarity
with options and tradeoffs in order to
properly arrive at an optimal design for
your particular situation.

By spending the proper time making professional, knowledgeable design deprocessional, anomorgenite design de-cisions at the beginning, a carefully planned deck will more than repay the effort for many years to come.
