

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

BREAK-INS

The passenger window was broken causing \$125 in damage to a blue 1988 Chevy pickup parked at Cranleigh in Farmington Hills Oct. 17 and a \$50 Bel radar detector, \$300 Sony AM/FM stereo, \$300 Motorola cellular phone, \$400 20 gauge Remington shotgun and \$200 tool box with tools were stolen.

The passenger window of a green 1995 Jeep Cherokee parked on Skye Drive in Farmington Hills Oct. 16-17 was broken (\$125) and a \$200 Motorola cellular phone was stolen.

The driver's window was broken (\$350) on a 1994 Chevy Beretta parked on Arden Park in Farmington Hills and speakers, a CD changer and a stereo (\$1,840 total) were stolen Oct. 17. DRUNKEN DRIVING

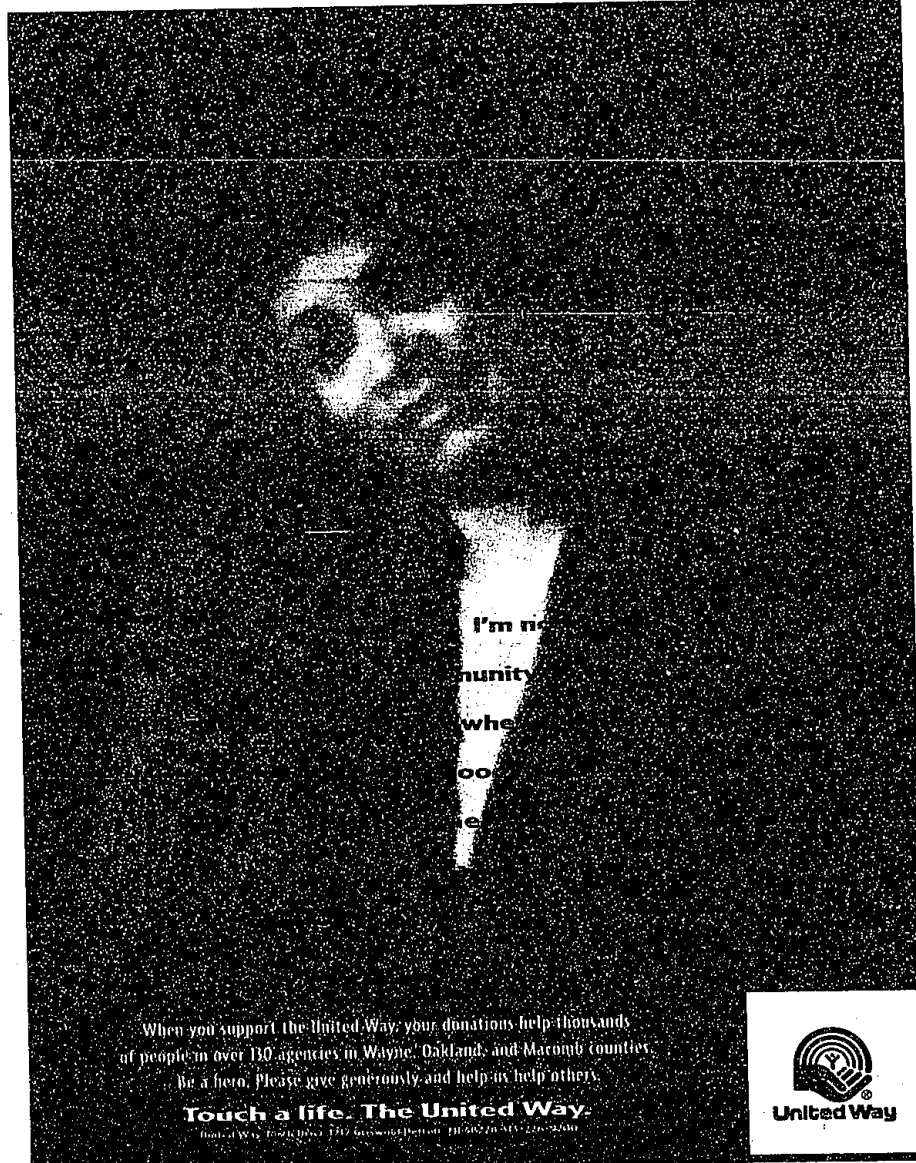
