Father can break rental agreement



ON Q. My father Auma lives on a fixed income. He has been waiting for subsidized housing for subsidized on more than the partment pepple finally called to say here with the har recently signed a lease for the apartment be presently lives in and there is no way he can pay for both his present apartment and the subsidized one. His land, ord insists on holding him to his lesse. Ded would like to more, but it seems that he is stuck in the spartment he now lives in, and who knows when another subsidized apartment will become available for him. Is there anything we can do?

Is there saything we can do?

A. Under a brand-new Michigan law, low-income older adults can break rental agreements when subtidized housing become available for them. This is House Bill 4257 (Public Act 79 of 1953). This new law allows people 62 years of age and older, who become eligible for subsidized senton housing to break their present rental agreements if they have lived in their present apartment for more than 13 months. A 60-day written notice of termination, however, is required. The law also applies to transus who are no tonger able to live independently. In this case, a notarized statement, from their physician, must be presented.

A. The first thing to do is contact the social work office in the hospital and get him or her involved with your situation. The social worker should be able to assist with arranging for homehelp, under Medicare, if your haband is eligible. Many hospitals have their own home-health-care agencies. However, some of the requirements are that his physician must prescribe home health care, it must be skilled care and your husband must be homebound. If you have the necessary funds to private pay for home care, the hospital social worker can also probably give you a list of agencies that are available in your location.

Q. My mother has to sign a e, My mother has to sign a new lease at her speriment. She is 89 and doing fairly well living on her own. The lease is for one year. My question is, should she die, am I then re-sponsible for paying for the re-mainder of the lease?

A. According to Michigan law, her new lease or rental spreement should specifically state that the estate of a tenant, 62 years of age or older, shall not be liable for more then 60 days or two months rent. Check your mother's new lease to make certain that this information is included.
