Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

■ VANDALISM

■ DRUNKEN DRIVING

Farmington Hills police arrested a Redford woman, 44, for driving a green 1994 Ford Tempo west on Grand River at Indoplex in Farmington Hills while drunk at 12:25 a.m. Nov. 1. The car was straddling two lanes. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .26 percent.

A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 responded to a fire that started on a stove at a residence on Rutledge Crossing in Farmington Hills at 2:09 p.m. Oct. 20. The fire had been put out by the time firefighters arrived. The homeowner told firefighters that she may have lit the wrong electric burner and left the grill unattended. She returned to find flames coming from the grill, turned off the power and covered the grill with a wood chopping block. There was a buildup of grease. Damage to contents was \$500.

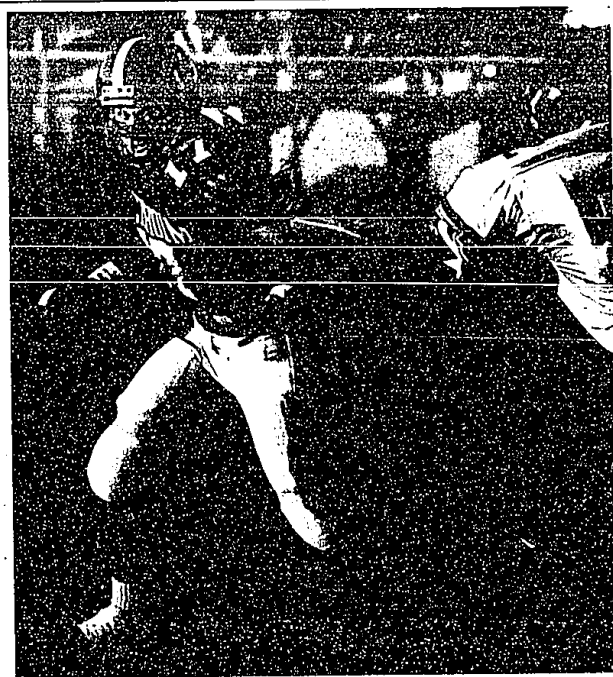

Drugstore ticketed in sting

Only one out of 19 Farmington liquor establishments sold beer to an underage decoy who was working with the Farmington Public Safety Department Oct. 18-19 as part of a liquor sting operation.

A 59-year-old female Rite-Aid Pharmacy clerk at the Bel-Aire Shopping Center at 10 Mile and Orchard Lake roads sold a six-pack of beer to a 16-year-old decoy at 7:05 p.m. on Oct. 18.

The clerk was cited for selling alcohol to a minor, a misdemeanor. She will appear in 47th District Court, where she faces a maximum fine of \$100, 90 days in jail or both.

Farmington police filed a complaint with the Michigan Liquor Control Commission against Rite-Aid. A commission hearing on the incident could result in a fine or the suspension of the store's liquor license.
