No one else is expected to be charged.

"The evidence we have implicates these two," Wiggins said. Liszewski was taken into custody by police at Western Michigan University, where he is a student. Palushaj turned himself in to Farmington police.

The girl was baby-sitting when two female friends arrived. They were followed later by three males who came with a case and a 40-ounce bottle of beer.

At least 13 more teens arrived at the house. The victim repeatedly asked them to leave, according to police reports.

From the Nov. 10, 1965, edition of the Farmington Enterprise:

William Garden, a Farmington police officer, arrested a man in Farmington who was wanted for murder in Detroit. A loaded pistol and shotgun were found in the car, police said.

Separate fires in Farmington Township destroyed the H & L Lumber Company on 10 Mile near Orchard Lake Road and damaged the Boys Republic at Inkater and Nine Mile roads.

Clarencville High School's football team, coached by Nick Ianni, finished the season unbeaten and united with a 12-0 victory over West Bloomfield. It was Clarencville's first perfect season in the 17-year history of the school. Team captains were Bob Soop, Bruce Moreno and John Lewis.
