"I've never seen someone suffering this much," Stanyar said as
her client, dressed in a flannel
shirt, tan dungarees and cenvas
shoes, set impassively unaware of
what was being said. The prosecutor and defense attorney's
waived translation of the proceedings until they were concluded.
Kogs, who speaks no English,
has gotten little sleep as the
events of that cool, rainy November night have come beak to her,
Stanyar said.
"In the Oakland County Jail,
people are yelling at all hours of
the night," Stanyar said. "She believes it is all directed at her. This
woman needs to be hospitalized."
But Oakland County assistant
prosecuting attorney Paul Walton
said that Koga was a risk to herself and could flee the country if
freed.

sufficient safeguards in a private hospital."

Walton said that once the case reaches circuit court, the woman could be treated at the state's fo-

reaches circuit court, the woman could be treated at the state's forensic center.

Stanyar said she expected that Koga could be admitted to the University of Michigan Medical Center's psychiatric unit. Fink said his client poeed no risk to others, only to herself.

"We have extradition treaties with Japun for capital offenses," Fink said. "The court has her pasport and she wouldn't flee." Parker said she would not allow bond, but would expedite a report to circuit court for a bond hearing as early as today, "I don't believe jail is appropriate at this time," Parker said, adding that she would ask pre-trial services to complete a report quickly so that a hearing could be held as soon as possible.

Oskland Circuit Court Judge Jessica Cooper will hear defense arguments for a change of bond this morning at 8:30 am. Bond has been denied so far.

At Friday's preliminary exam, Parker bound over Koga on first degree murder based on the requirement of premeditation and based on the felony murder statute.

Judge Parker said that did not require any judgment on the gult of the defendant or her mental capacity at this stage. Parker said testimony showed that the woman walked a long distance with the child, dressed for the weather but did not dress the beby for the cold, told no one that the beby was at the pond until questioned later and did not attempt to rescue the child.

The autopsy showed that the child died from drewning, Judge Parker said.

"The baby was not capable at less than a month old to roll into the water himself," she said.

The arraignment is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Dec. 28 in front of Judge Cooper in Oakland Circuit Court.
